Call to boost bilateral trade in Malaysia-Thailand border areas

BANGKOK: Malaysia and Thailand want to enhance bilateral trade ties, especially in the border areas and are studying several proposals to achieve the goal, said Second Finance Minister Datuk Seri Johari Abdul Ghani.

One of the proposals, he said, involved further facilitating the movements of goods and containers from Songkla Port in southern Thailand to Penang Port.

"The Thailand government is excited about this proposal as the distance between the two ports is 260km, or four hours of travel," he told *Bernama* after delivering the keynote address at the business forum here today.

The forum, which is jointly organised by the Malaysia-Thailand Business Council and Thailand-Malaysia Business Council, was held in conjunction with the three-day visit to Thailand by the Kuala Lumpur Business Club (KLBC) headed by its president Tengku Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz who is also the CIMB Group chief executive officer.

Earlier, Johari and the KLBC entourage paid a courtesy call on Thailand's Deputy Prime Minister Somkid Jatusripitak at his office.

Johari said the proposal to build an inland port at Bukit Kayu Hitam would also enhance bilateral trade relations and boost the overall trade between the two countries.

He said the inland port would handle goods from Thailand en route to the export markets in West Asia and Europe due to the short distance involved.

"We will develop Bukit Kayu Hitam so that it would become the distribution hub in the region," he said.

Malaysia, which has an economy of US\$300 billion (US\$1 = RM4.20) and Thailand US\$400 billion, should collaborate to enhance bilateral trade, Johari said.

"This is because of the combined economic value of US\$700 billion for both the countries, the bilateral trade only amounted to US\$20 billion annually. The opportunities for both countries to increase trade are tremendous," he said.

Malaysia and Thailand have targeted bilateral trade to grow to US\$30 billion annually in 2018.

Johari said the KLBC's visit to Thailand was to seek business opportunities in various economic sectors, including financial services, which would further enhance trade relations between the two countries. — *Bernama*

KL Business Club strengthens business ties with Thailand

BANGKOK — Kuala Lumpur Business Club (KLBC) president Tengku Datuk Seri Zafrul Aziz, on a mission in Bangkok, said Malaysia and Thailand are well-poised to thrive as Asean begins to realise its full economic potential.

"As the global market begins to recognize Asean's economic importance, both Malaysia and Thailand — being not just more advanced economies in this region but also immediate neighbours with 60 years of diplomatic relations — are wellpoised to thrive as Asean begins to realise its full economic potential.


Besides providing better linkage between the two ports, Prayut said he and Johari also discussed on the development of the Rubber City between the Songkla province in southern Thailand and Kedah.

Prime Minister Prayut Chan-o-cha has requested further support from Malaysia to help maintain law and order in the far South.

Gen Prayut made the request during discussions with a Malaysian delegation at Government House yesterday on various types of cross-border cooperation including security measures, said Lt Gen Werachon Sukondhapatipak, a deputy government spokesman.

The visiting Malaysian team was led by Datuk Seri Johari bin Abdul Ghani, the Malaysian second finance minister, and consisted also of executives of business associations in Malaysia.

Gen Prayut pointed out during yesterday's discussions with his Malaysian guests that security is a key factor in sustaining both countries' development, said Lt Gen Werachon.
