KLBC Fireside Chat with En. Ahmad Zulqarnain Onn, President & Group Chief Executive of Permodalan Nasional Berhad (PNB)

- 5. Geopolitical investment considerations and the importance of ESG factors.
- 6. Progressive wage growth and labour market flexibility.

Throughout the session, En. Ahmad Zulqarnain Onn emphasised PNB's mission to play a central role in Malaysia's economy and financial landscape by democratising market access and offering cost-effective products to the public. The Fireside Chat, marked by its engaging and insightful dialogue, lasted nearly an hour and featured questions from KLBC members on the following topics:

- 1. Strategies for managing portfolios to ensure stable returns, with a focus on catering to a diverse group of unit holders and creating additional value.
- 2. Approaches to enhance portfolio value and generate higher returns.
- 3. Identified sectors with growth potential, including healthcare, the cyber industry, and the digitalisation of the economy.
- 4. PNB's commitment to sending 25 students to top schools annually, emphasising the importance of investing in child education in Malaysian society.
- 5. Discussions on skill development initiatives without heavy reliance on external vendors.

- 6. Exploring opportunities for increased investment in China.
- 7. Challenges related to investments in clean energy due to higher costs.
- 8. The future of Bumiputera investments.
- 9. Concerns about stagnant real wage increases and limited entry-level job opportunities.
- 10. Malaysia's potential to embrace technology and adapt labour market flexibility to boost economic prospects.

The Fireside Chat concluded at 2:00 PM with closing remarks delivered by Dato' Fad'l Mohamed, KLBC's Deputy President. En. Ahmad Zulqarnain Onn received a certificate of appreciation from FRIM, in support of a tree planting programme at the Forest Research Institute of Malaysia with KLBC-sponsored trees. The session drew an audience of 35 KLBC members and guests.
